English Curriculum

The ability to use language and explore literature is key to the way in which children learn across all subjects, think creatively and make their own mark on the world around them. Our aim at Boxgrove is to provide children with purposeful opportunities within which to read, write and speak. The Curriculum objectives across the school can be found at the bottom of this document. The curriculum is designed as a spiral and key objectives will be taught and revisited throughout the year.

Each class uses a blend of the Cornerstones Topic, fabulous texts, experiences, visits and visitors to plan units of learning in a variety of genres. The units will vary in length but all follow a process of small steps which culminates in a piece of writing.

Each piece of writing will have an 'audience' and sense of purpose. Recently children have:

- Written to an archeologist to invite them to speak during a history topic
- Sent a letter to their families having been in role as an Evacuee
- Written their own adverts for a moon buggy to be filmed and watched by their peers

The small steps along the writing journey allow children to

- 1. investigate and analyse the structure of a genre of writing
- 2. broaden their vocabulary
- 3. use a variety of systems to plan
- 4. be supported as they start to build their writing
- 5. revisit their written work to proofread for errors
- 6. learn from peers and have the opportunity through discussion to edit and make changes to their learning
- 7. share their writing in a variety of formats and audience

English is taught in units which may go across 1, 2 or 3 weeks. Each unit has a complimentary text which allows the children to see a variety of authorship styles and immerse themselves within a genre.

There is a daily English lesson which focuses on the planned unit of writing together with:

- weekly guided reading sessions which provide further opportunity to explore style, vocabulary use, author intent and grammar.
- discrete weekly spelling and grammar lessons which where possible make natural links to the writing unit
- phonics lessons three times a week in phase groups across the school
