<u>Parent events</u> - Thank you to those parents who were able to come to the Meet the teacher events for Owl and Fox Class. It was great to be able to share key messages at the start of the year, especially for children who are new to those classes. There are several workshops planned for parents already and we hope to arrange more of these this year, as well as inviting parents into the school to share in learning.

On Monday it was lovely to see everyone waiting to come into school when I unlocked the gates. Just a reminder that the **gates close at 8.45am** and your child will be marked as late if they arrive after this time. If your child is late regularly, it impacts on their day as they constantly miss the beginning of each day's learning.

<u>Outdoor learning</u> - starts on Wednesday next week for children in Year 2. Even if the weather is still warm, they need to have their arms and legs covered to participate in the session fully. Sessions for Year 2 take place on 13th, 20th, 27th September 4th and 11th October.

Help Your Child Love Maths - Learn how to support your children to develop positive attitudes towards maths. We know that maths can sometimes seem daunting, but engaging positively with children's learning can make a big difference to both children's and parents' confidence with numbers. Therefore, we are inviting all parents/carers to a unique workshop run by National Numeracy which will be held at the school on Tuesday 12th September at 2pm. The workshop is not a maths lesson, nor does it teach any maths, but is focused on fostering positive attitudes towards numeracy and tips for ensuring your children develop these too. The session will cover the importance of maths in the real world, being positive about maths, promoting a growth mindset and how to boost your own number skills as an adult.
