The Blue Letter: 20th November 2020



Dear Parents and Carers,

There is an established link between the home learning environment at all ages and children's performance at school. We aim to be a school where home and parents work together to deliver the best outcomes for our pupils. Your child will come home from school in the next week with a copy of our home-school agreement that we would like you and your child to read and sign, the signed part needs returning to school. It outlines how we aim to work together to support your child in making progress. With this in mind, please can we ask that children have their reading books, word or letter wallets, reading records, book bags etc. in school everyday. We have various adults in school during the week to support children's learning and they need the contents of their book bag to support this. The half termly curriculum letter, outlines how you can support your child at home, this may be by hearing them read, practising spellings or phonics or helping and supporting their homework tasks. Creating a regular routine and encouraging children to set goals, plan, and manage their time, effort and emotions can help children regulate their own learning. As children get older this is often more valuable than direct help with homework. For young children promoting shared book reading as well as activities linked to playing with letters and numbers is well documented to be linked to improved outcomes for children.

You should have received a letter today explaining how this term's parent consultation meetings will work. They are scheduled for <u>Wednesday 2nd and Wednesday 9th December</u>. The login details for Squirrel Class and the instructions for Google Classroom were sent home a couple of weeks ago and the class codes have been emailed.

Year 6 parents, if you have not yet applied for a secondary school place, you can submit a late application before <u>27th November</u>. This hopefully will ensure you will receive an offer on allocation day on 1 March.

Collective Worship
