Year 1	<p>Look at the white rose maths home learning page (see the link below)</p> <p><a href="https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/">https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-1/</a></p> <p>There is a maths video and related activity for each day</p> <p>If you can't print the activity sheet you can look at the questions on the screen talk to your child about the answer. You could write some notes in your child's book about how they got on with the task.</p>	<p>Practice handwriting- try and incorporate tricky and decodable words from the phonics and decodable words section. Can you write a sentence for each word?</p> <p>Ask your child to draw their 'dream bedroom'. What would they include? A slide, candyfloss making machine, walkie talkies, trampoline? Be as inventive as you can! Write five sentences about your design. Use phonics to help you with unknown words. After you have written, check you have spelt correctly any words that you have already learnt to spell</p>	<p>Tricky words:</p> <p>Said Like Do Come People called Mr Mrs Looked Friend Would Should Could By</p> <p>These words don't follow the phonic rules, maybe make some flash cards to help your child read and practice these</p>	<p>Please practice the half term spellings</p> <p>Extra words to practice: It's From House Made Saw your Help Children Says Old</p>	<p>Please continue to read with your child at least three times a week. Discuss any unfamiliar words and what the word means. Can they put that word into a spoken sentence?</p> <p>Read a story to your child. Can they recall the key events and retell the story in time order?</p> <p>Complete a comprehension sheet- A New Pet. You don't need to print this – just write the answers in your book.</p> <p>If you could have any pet- what would it be and why? Draw and write about your favourite pet.</p>	<p>Art and crafts: make models using recycled items that you have at home (empty toilet rolls, cardboard boxes, empty milk or juice cartoons) if you are able to, you could take a photograph to add to your book and write about what you have made.</p> <p>Read about the first Easter. You could then have a go at making an Easter garden.
