I would like you to complete **3** of the homework tasks, and you must choose from both rows. Your homework needs to be of a **good quality**. Think about **presentation**, and don't forget to **challenge yourself**!

First piece of homework will be due on **Friday 18<sup>th</sup> January**, the second piece on **Friday 1<sup>st</sup> February** and the final piece on **Monday 11<sup>th</sup> February**.

Imagine the Earth has entered another Ice Age. Write a diary-style piece describing the changes and how the human race has adapted to cope.	Find out what natural resources and raw materials are reaped from the Arctic. What impact does this have on the environment?	Create a poster or brochure for a new travel company which arranges visits to the Arctic or Antarctic. Use powerful images and text to tempt customers who want an extra-special trip!	Create a set of polar animal top trump cards. Make use of interesting facts you find out about the animals.	Write an information leaflet about your favourite polar animal. Use images to improve the look of your leaflet but remember to provide plenty of key facts.
Use a range of snowy images to create a polar collage. Remember to use lots of interesting textures, shapes, colours and patterns.	Make a model of your favourite Arctic animal using clay, dough or recycled materials. Be able to explain to everyone how you made it.	Design a pair of snow boots for an Arctic explorer. What materials would you use? What features could they have? Let your imagination run wild!	Design and make a board game which has a polar theme. You could base it on explorers reaching the North pole, or polar animals' homes.	Ice and snow landscapes create stunning pieces of art. Use these landscapes as a stimulus for your own art work. Paint, pastels, photography.... Be adventurous!
