Dear Parents and Carers,

You may have received a text or letter from Public Health England letting you know that you can still visit a clinic to get your child's influenza nasal spray. We have been asked to let you know to ignore these if you know your child has had the vaccine. If you need any guidance you can call the Chichester office on 01273 696011 x8100. If your child was due to have the vaccine in school but your child was absent, you should have received an email enabling you to book an appointment at a catch up clinic. , If your child did not receive the flu vaccination, and you would like them to be vaccinated, it's not too late. Please ensure that you complete an online consent form, if you have not already done so. Go to www.susseximmunisations.co.uk/Forms/Flu and follow the instructions. Once you have completed a consent form you will receive an email enabling you to book an appointment at a catch up clinic.

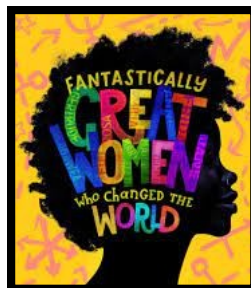
Fox Class
