Just a reminder that if you would like to book a school Christmas lunch for your child the deadline for booking **is Sunday 6th December.**


Advent Calendar Collection

Collective Worship

Next week our worship theme is Advent. We will be using the idea of the Jesse Tree as a way of preparing for Christmas by journeying through the stories on Jesus's family tree. The Jesse Tree tradition is rooted in Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots."



Jesse was the father of David, Israel's greatest king. And Jesus is descended from the line of David. He is the branch God promised would grow from Jesse's family tree. Each story has a matching symbol which represents a story from within this family tree and a step toward the birth of Jesus. Traditionally these symbols are then hung on a branch or small tree through Advent.
