Year 6 Outdoor learning

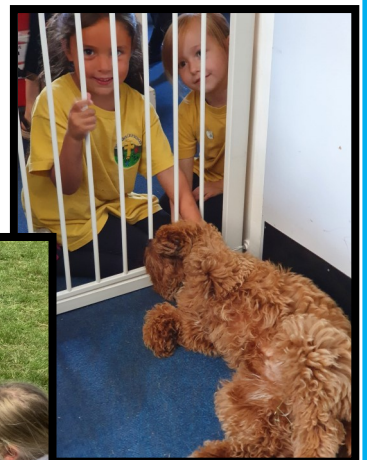
