Dear Parents and Carers,

<u>Little Hoot Design Competition</u> - We are asking any child who would like to, to enter our competition to create a design entry for our Owl. The winning entry will then be painted onto the Owl, which will be displayed in Chichester over the summer. We are asking the children to return their designs by Friday 3rd May. Competition entries will cost £1 which will go towards the £795 that we are aiming to raise. We are also planning to have a non-uniform day on <u>Friday 17th May</u> in return for donations towards our fundraising for Chestnut Tree House.



<u>Fidgets in the classroom</u> - Studies have shown that using fidgets and stress balls can increase focus and attention and also work as a stress management tool. There are some children in school who are using them following conversations between teachers and parents as part of a plan to support their child. In order for the fidget to be helpful as a learning tool rather than being used as a toy, they need to be quiet, discreet, have an interesting texture and allow finger and hand movement. We are finding an increasing number of fidget toys coming in from home that are becoming a distraction in class. We have lots of fidgets in school to support the children that need them and would ask that children don't bring their own in from home please. It also means that there a no upsets around lost or broken fidgets in school. We appreciate your support with this.

<u>Frozen Fridays</u> - From next Friday afternoon (<u>3rd May</u>) we will be selling ice lollies at the end of the school day, and on Fridays for the rest of this term. They will cost just £1. Hopefully the sun will begin to shine and we will be able to start our weekends with a refreshing treat! Profits will be split between the Friends PTA and our fundraising for Chestnut Tree House.

Boxgrove Green Gardeners

Gardening on Wednesday got off to an EGGcelent start! The free range organic eggs were generously donated by Rookery Farm in Flansham. It was lovely to see the older children being supportive of the younger ones, helping them with their Cress Head activity when they needed it. Whilst the children worked on their colourful egg shell funny faces and sewed their cress seeds, we shared some interesting facts about eggs and cress. Who knew that eggs have been to space? Astronaut John Young rocketed into space with an egg salad sandwich on the STS-12 Mission! The world's largest egg was laid by an ostrich in 1947 and was 24 times the size of the eggs the children were decorating! If you want to know how fresh your breakfast egg is, see if it floats or sinks. A floating egg should not be eaten, a sinking egg is fresh! Creativity makes for hungry children, so our session was rounded off with gluten free crackers and egg mayonnaise from the eggs used in the activity - no waste here at Boxgrove and the children munched away happily thanks to Rookery Farm's happy chickens! The children learnt that cress is a micro-green important in their diet and will be watering and watching their Cress Heads grow over the next week. We''ll compare how much their 'cress hair' has grown at next week's gardening club! Cress grows super fast within 5-7 days of sewing.

Next Wednesday (1st May) the children will be creating beautiful, vibrantly painted miniature hanging flower pots from tins that we will be hanging in the outside areas. We will need 24 old baked bean or other food tins (cleaned and with lids and any sharp areas removed) that the children can paint/decorate and plant up with flower seeds next week. We look forward to inspiring our gardeners as they grow in confidence by growing all things green and colourful!
