Dear Parents and Carers,

If your child is in the current reception year or year one and you don't want them to have school meals in September, please email the <u>office</u> and let them know. ### Year 6 Outdoor learning

This week we have been learning : whittling, how to saw safely, how to use an axe safely and how to make a tipi fire. We had a great time making the tipi fire, using thick sticks and kindling to make it into the shape of a tipi. We used some tops as a fire starter, which last week we had made into charcoal, didn't really work. So we went back to using cotton wool which made the fire roar. For whittling we collected some hazel sticks and made one of the ends sharp with a knife (the knifes were used safely) and we made the other end flat to write our names. With the sawing we got a big log which was dead so was pretty easy but also quite hard to cut. We used a bow-saw and did it in pairs. Some people then went with Mrs. Scott and used an axe to split the logs that we had cut in half. At the end we were treated to some Oreo hot chocolate and marshmallows.
