

The Blue Letter: 22nd May 2020



Dear Parents/Carers ,

We have been working hard this week on risk assessments and plans for any wider reopening of school if the government indicates that it is safe for us to do so. Our staffing, and the limitations of the building mean that we will only be able to take back a maximum of 45 children in three groups of 15. The priority for places will be given to vulnerable children, those with Education, Health and Care Plans and the children of key workers, across all year groups. This means that we will not be able to open the school more fully to all of the year groups that the government has asked us to. I will be sending a letter containing full details of what we are safely able to offer in the next few days. This letter will also include how we plan to keep the children and staff who are on site safe.

School will be closed next week for half term and therefore there will be no home learning set. If you wish to continue working with your child during the week, there may be some tasks from this half term's topic that you have been unable to finish or you might like to look at lessons on The National Oak Academy Website or BBC bitesize.

Monday 1st June will be an INSET day. New home learning and any potential wider reopening will be from Tuesday 2nd June.


Well done to anyone who has completed the challenges and entered their scores on the website
