Covid Changes

You are likely to have heard that changes have been made to the legal requirements for those who are displaying coronavirus symptoms. This doesn't mean that we will be making any changes to our requirements at school. Children and staff who test positive will continue to be asked to stay at home. After 5 days, they should take a Flow Test (LFT) followed by another the next day - if both are negative, and they do not have a temperature, they can safely return to school. If your child displays any official symptoms please book a PCR test. Thank you for your continued support in keeping the case rates as low as possible in our school community.

We have talked in our worship this week about the things other countries are doing to help the people of Ukraine and you should have seen the parentmail sent this week about the practical way you can help if you would like. They have asked that we don't send any clothes. Mrs Sheehan will be taking our collection of items to them next Thursday 10th March.
