The current 'delivered in hot' system is changing in anticipation of our kitchen pod being on site in September. The kitchen pod will mean that the food will be prepared through the steamplicity process in line with all other West Sussex Schools. In the cross over period in the summer term, the delivered in hot system will no longer operate in the same way and instead of food cooked specifically for us (along with the other schools in this system) the food will be prepared through the steamplicity system and then delivered to us hot.
