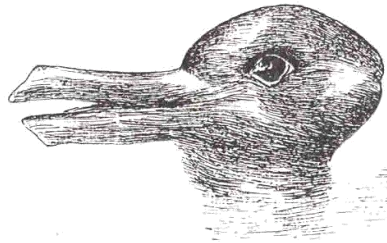
Golden Book 🌟
