Dear Parents and Carers,

A wet and blowy welcome back to the second half of the autumn term! It's going to be a busy 7 weeks! Each class has a new topic and they will be sharing topic letters and homework grids with you shortly - if they haven't already. There are lots of activities planned so do keep an eye on newsletters and parentmail to keep you updated.

<u>Collective Worship update</u> - In our Collective Worship we will continue to use the story of Moses to help us to reflect on some important ideas about being community together and about God, who looked after them. These stories can be found in the Bible, the Torah and the Qur'an, recognising Moses as a prophet and leader in all three of these traditions: these stories often generate some challenging questions about judgement and justice (especially from older pupils), so in these collective worship sessions we choose to emphasise the positive messages and outcomes e.g. God seeing and responding to the cruel treatment of the people, and being with his people.

Alongside this the children from Owl Class will continue to work with Mrs Dommett to lead our Picture News Worship sessions where we think together about items in the news and how they link to British Values, Protected Characteristics, Our Rights Respecting Schools work and our Christian vision.

Fundraising this half term- We have several fundraising events in the next 7 weeks, both for school and for other charities:

- Friday 17th November is Children in Need day. Your children are welcome to come to school in either, spots, yellow, or children in need merchandise in return for a donation to Children in Need.

Poppy Appeal

We have a box of Poppies and a collecting tin for the Royal British Legion (RBL) again this year. As well as the Poppies we have various other items for which there is a suggested donation.
