Further Fundraising

Start of the Day procedures

Just a reminder that children are not allowed into the classrooms before 8.35am. If you are waiting to send your child into Squirrel Class, please wait until Mrs Dommett or another member of staff is outside to indicate that is time to go in. If you need to get a message to the teacher before this time, please speak to the office. We encourage all Squirrel Class children to say goodbye to parents at the wooden gate, rather than come to the classroom door if at all possible. Thank you for your support in developing this independence in your children and making the flow of children easier in the mornings.

Industrial Action

You may be aware, that following a ballot, the NEU (National Education Union) has confirmed that its members will be striking. These are likely to happen both nationally and regionally, with national strikes scheduled to take place on 1 February, 15 and 16 March, in addition to a regional strike for the south-east, south-west and London on 2 March.

This will mean that the usual running of our school may be impacted for a maximum of four days over the next two months. We are currently in the process of assessing our staffing ratio, which will determine what level of provision will be delivered during these days. It may be that we have sufficient staff members to safely open the school as usual, or we may need to consider a partial opening for some year groups, or a full closure.

The safety and wellbeing of our students is our top priority and so any decision we take will be with that at the centre. Whilst we are giving you early notice on the likelihood of our usual provision potentially being impacted, we are unlikely to be in a position to inform you of any changes until much closer to each individual strike day, or potentially even on the strike day itself, given the nature of industrial action. However, we will of course endeavour to keep you as informed as possible.
