Dear Parents and Carers,

Next week is full of fun Christmas activities for the children. At the start of the week, the children will be busy putting the final preparations together for **'Fireside Nativity'**. The performances take place in Church on **Wednesday 13th December at 2pm and 6pm**. We look forward to seeing you there. If you need to bring younger siblings to watch, please try to bring them to the afternoon performance rather than the evening one. Also, please take them out if they get noisy - it not only helps everyone to hear, but means the performing children don't get distracted. After the afternoon performance the children will come back to school to be dismissed.

The children will bring their costumes home after the afternoon performance. **Please can they be back in Church not before 5.50pm.** - in costume please. When you arrive in church, please ask your child to sit with you until the teachers are ready for them and not to run around. Thank you for your support.

There is no charge to attend the performance, however, we do have a collection as you leave. This year the money from this collection will be given to Chestnut Tree House.

There are events at the St Blaise Centre and the village at the same time as our afternoon nativity performance. Please try to walk if you can and think carefully about where you park a car if you need to come by car. The children walk from school to church and back again and we need the road to be safe for them to cross.

Thursday is our Christmas Craft day where the children have the opportunity to work in their house teams rather than classes to create some fun decorations. It is also the day for Chartwells Christmas dinner. If your child has a packed lunch, you might like to make it a special one or add a festive treat. There will be Christmas Crackers for the children to enjoy too.

Friday is our Christmas Breakfast Morning! For new families to the school, this may seem an unusual event, but it's great fun! We ask the children to bring in breakfast to eat with their friends in the classroom. This could be some cereal (please send a bowl, spoon and milk!), or a bacon sandwich, maybe some toast or a croissant. Whatever you think your child might like to eat. We do ask that you don't send peanut butter, Nutella or other nut products as we do have some children who are allergic. Then the children in Squirrel Class are off to the theatre to see the Three Billy Goats Gruff.

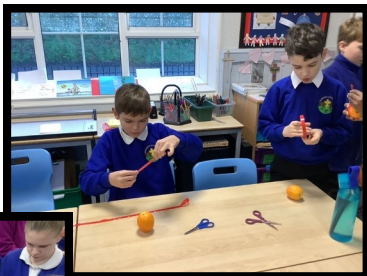
Christmas Tree Festival and Christingle Service
