<u>Staff News</u> - Congratulations to Mrs Squires who has secured a new job working with the migration and settlement service. Special Needs Coordinator Role (SENCO) - Mrs Dommett remains the SENCO for the school but is now being supported by Mrs Pendle who is working as Assistant SENCO. If your child needs some SEN support in the form of an assessment or checklist to be carried out, this is likely to be completed by Mrs Pendle. She will also be completing a lot of the paperwork linked to Special Needs. If you need to discuss Special Needs, you may be offered an appointment with Mrs Pendle rather than Mrs Dommett. Mrs Pendle usually spends Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons working on special needs.

Supporting your child with Fears and Worries - We are very lucky as a school, to have the support of the West Sussex Mental Health in Schools Team, Thought-Full. As well as working with children and staff, they offer parent support. We will be hosting a 5 week course for parents to help with supporting your child with fears and worries. The course will run on 5 Mondays starting 10th June from 3.15pm for just over an hour. Childcare for school age children will be available. The course is also open to parents of children due to join us in September. Feedback on the course from parents in other schools has been really positive and parents say they were pleased they joined. This course is for all parents. It will provide ideas to enable you to support your child with transition as well as any other worries and fears your child may have.

<u>Frozen Fridays</u> - Our weekly ice lollies sales start today. They will cost just £1. Hopefully the sun will begin to shine and we will be able to start our weekends with a refreshing treat! Profits will be split between the Friends PTA and our fundraising for Chestnut Tree House.
